



TRAINING PROGRAMS




For students in Years 3-6

Foundation Program

— Designed with students from South East Queensland in mind, the Foundation Program is the first point of entry into Queensland Ballet Academy's elite training programs, and is delivered after school each weekday during term time. There is no minimum attendance required, although Queensland Ballet Academy recommends two sessions per week for students aged 8–9, and three sessions per week for students aged 10 and older. Ongoing coaching and feedback are used to monitor the placement and progression of all students.

At this young age, we welcome students from all backgrounds to attend our Pre-selection Experience.

Students are grouped according to skill level determined from the pre-selection process, and may continue activities with their external dance studios if they wish.



For students in Years 7-12

Academy Program

— This program combines rigorous ballet training with senior academic studies at Kelvin Grove State College. It is best suited to elite students who wish to pursue a professional career in ballet or dance.

Academy Program students undertake full-time dance training (up to 25 hours per week) and a face-to-face academic study load. All students are enrolled at Kelvin Grove State College and on completion of Year 12 receive a Queensland Certificate of Education and, if eligible, an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR).

Daily classes in the Academy Program cover all aspects of classical ballet and related disciplines, including:

- Body conditioning
- Classical character and historical dance
- Contemporary dance
- Male fitness
- Male technique
- Pas de deux
- Pointe
- Repertoire

Additional studies are offered across all levels to impart further industry

For students residing outside Brisbane

Guest Academy Program

— Our Academy Program from Levels 6–4 caters for elite students living outside the Brisbane metropolitan area, including intrastate, interstate or international locations. Entry into the Guest Academy Program is through selection at the scheduled audition, or via invitation through Queensland Ballet Academy's Elite Training Series or Summer School, or through external competitions. Students are invited to join Academy Program classes during a three—five day visit each term of the Queensland state school calendar. At the discretion of the Academy Director, students may be awarded short-term, fee-free scholarships.

At Kelvin Grove State College, we take a holistic approach to developing young people's learning. Our curriculum is progressive, inclusive, innovative and caring, while still incorporating the core elements of education that have traditionally been essential for success.

The College has exceptional academic and university pathways, as well as futures-focused industry partnerships and pathways.

Interstate transfers

— It can be daunting to move to a secondary school where there are new teachers and peers to meet, new surroundings and a different approach to scheduling to get used to.

If your child needs to move to Queensland from interstate, Kelvin Grove State College may request consent from you to obtain student data from the previous school. This system, along with the guidance and care provided by Kelvin Grove State College and Queensland Ballet Academy support staff, ensures all transferring students' educational and pastoral care needs are met.

International entry requirements

— International students wishing to apply for entry into Queensland Ballet Academy and Kelvin Grove State College are required to meet all Queensland Department of Education and Education Queensland International eligibility criteria, including the minimum English language proficiency levels.



Homestay

— An established Australian and International Homestay Program is in place to assist schoolaged students from regional, interstate and international locations in finding safe, suitable family accommodation in Brisbane.

Host families undergo a thorough household assessment, with successful registration being dependent on the implementation of a risk management strategy and meeting the Queensland Government's Working with Children Authority Blue Card requirements. Ongoing specialist support is provided for the management of all homestay matters.



CAREER ENTRY PROGRAMS

Queensland Ballet Academy and Company provide pathways for dancers wishing to continue professional training on completion of their senior schooling.

Post-secondary school studies

Pre-Professional Program

— This full-time finishing year offers outstanding young dancers the real-world preparation they need to join a professional company.

The Pre-Professional Program is based in Queensland Ballet's home in West End and provides students with studio-to-stage professional experience. Throughout the year, dancers prepare for their artistic careers by performing alongside the Company, as well as in standalone productions.

Aside from the Academy's invaluable connection with Queensland Ballet, students also learn from guest creatives through a range of intensive workshops and collaborations.

Classes include:

- Classical ballet
- Male technique
- Pointe work
- Pas de deux
- Repertoire
- Contemporary dance
- Body conditioning

Career preparation studies

Successful completion of the Pre-Professional Program ensures students are ready to seek employment with leading ballet and contemporary companies in Australia and overseas. At this point, dancers are also welcome to apply to audition for entry into Queensland Ballet Company's Jette Parker Young Artist Program.

Queensland Ballet apprenticeship

Jette Parker Young Artist Program

— The Jette Parker Young Artist Program is one of the leading ballet development programs in the Asia-Pacific region.

Enabled by the generosity of Jette and Alan Parker through the Oak Foundation, this year-long salaried Company trainee program provides a unique opportunity to refine technique and artistry for early career progression. This apprenticeship serves as an entry program into Queensland Ballet. Recipients rehearse and perform as part of the Company, as well as premiering works created specifically for them.

Mentored by Queensland Ballet's Artistic team, dancers undertake a series of professional and personal development intensives to prepare them for career opportunities with leading Australian and international dance companies. On completion of the Program, dancers are welcome to audition for a contract position in Queensland Ballet Company, or other companies in Australia and overseas.

WORKSHOPS AND ACTIVITIES



Elite Training Series

— A unique opportunity for students from nine years of age to work with Queensland Ballet Academy's world-class faculty as they tour the Elite Training Series across the country.

Participants enjoy classes in ballet, technique, contemporary and character dance, as well as information forums focusing on auditions, safe dance practice, training methodology, our academic partner and more. These information sessions are open to parents of participants as well as dance teachers.



Audition Experience Day

— A simulated ballet audition event for students from nine years of age.

Held on the Royal Brisbane Show public holiday in August, this session focuses on developing essential auditioning skills. It covers an audition structured ballet class with a call-back component and practical insights through an information forum hosted by current Queensland Ballet Academy staff, Company artists and other industry experts.



Summer School

— Held during the Queensland school summer holidays, students aged 10–18 years old are invited to immerse themselves in the life of the Queensland Ballet Academy.

In a culture of collaboration and excellence, Summer School students join with like-minded aspiring dancers to learn from the Queensland Ballet Academy team and special guest coaches.



Masterclasses

— At various times throughout the year, aspiring young dancers can take part in exclusive masterclasses with our talented faculty.

Classes are offered at various locations and offer participants the opportunity to learn more about Queensland Ballet Academy, its programs and life at Kelvin Grove State College.

ACADEMY LOCATION AND FACILITIES

Queensland Ballet Academy is split between two primary locations, depending on your program of enrolment:

- Queensland Ballet Academy at Kelvin Grove: Foundation Program (Levels 9-7) and Academy Program (Levels 6-1, including Guest Academy Program)
- Queensland Ballet Studios at West End:
 Pre-Professional Program, integrated
 alongside Company and Jette Parker Young
 Artist activities

Our building at Kelvin Grove is located just 3 km (1.9 miles) from Brisbane's central business district, and 5 km (3.1 miles) from our home in West End.

About Kelvin Grove

— A bustling student community close to the Queensland University of Technology, Kelvin Grove is a tight-knit multicultural community with a village atmosphere.

Our building sits on Kelvin Grove State
College's campus, ensuring minimal travel
distance for our full-time students while they
complete their academic schooling. The building
contains six world-class ballet studios, a wellness
suite containing a physiotherapy clinic, Pilates
room and gym, and student quarters.

About West End

— Located just a stone's throw away from Brisbane's cultural precinct, West End is a trendy and modern area with plenty to keep you busy.

Students at Queensland Ballet's West
End studios enjoy the buzzing atmosphere of
Company rehearsals and community classes
taking place concurrently. Physiotherapy services
and a wellness centre are also available, as well as
a gym and dedicated dancers' quarters.



ACADEMY LOCATION AND FACILITIES













Queensland Ballet Academy's program structure has been professionally designed to ensure dancers are career-ready.

— Aside from technical training, students also undertake complementary studies and enjoy access to performances at Brisbane's cultural precinct throughout the year. Our Foundation and Academy Program students also partake in excursions to Queensland Ballet Studios to meet and observe our Company dancers in season rehearsals.

Academy and Pre-Professional Program students gain live performance experience showcasing their year's work to family, friends, community members and VIPs at the *Queensland Ballet Academy Gala*, held annually. Students also receive opportunities to dance in Queensland Ballet's ensemble in season productions. This ensures they leave the Academy prepared for a healthy and dynamic career in dance.

On successful completion of Academy Pre-Professional training, dancers may audition for a place in the Jette Parker Young Artist Program for entry into Queensland Ballet.

Otherwise, at this point dancers may seek career employment in companies across Australia and overseas.

Dancers accepted into Queensland Ballet receive continual career development opportunities, and transition preparation is embedded throughout all stages of their engagement. Ensuring awareness, preparation and planning for life, both during and after the performance phase, is a responsibility Queensland Ballet takes in earnest.

Exchange

Queensland Ballet Academy is proud to foster strong international exchange partnerships. Our students have the opportunity to gain global training experience in world-class ballet institutions, as well as building professional relationships with young international dancers. Best of all, it means our students receive further professional development to ensure they reach their full dance potential.

FOSTERING HEALTH AND WELLBEING

At Queensland Ballet Academy, the physical and mental wellbeing of our students is our highest priority. All students have access to a range of services to ensure they develop to the best of their ability throughout the course of their program.

— Both West End and Kelvin Grove locations have full-time accredited physiotherapists working on-site. Physiotherapy sessions are private and confidential, and full-time students may access these services at no extra cost.

The Academy building in Kelvin Grove also features a student-only wellness centre, including physiotherapy, Pilates and gym areas. The gym is available for injury prevention, general fitness and strength training under the guidance of a professional strength and conditioning coach.

All staff at Queensland Ballet Academy undergo child safety training annually, and many are trained in mental health first aid to ensure our students feel happy and supported throughout their development.

Support services

— Our specialised Business team is equipped to provide support for students and families in the areas of enrolment and pastoral care. A dedicated Admissions and Wellbeing Manager continually monitors each student's welfare throughout their journey at the Academy.

Through Kelvin Grove State College, our Academy Program students also receive support in the form of chaplaincy, guidance and career information services, curriculum support, welfare support, a school nurse and a school-based police officer.

AUDITIONS

Queensland Ballet Academy auditions are held annually from August to November, in Brisbane and around Australia. Registrations open mid-year.

Pre-Professional Program and Academy Program auditions

— Auditions take the format of an open ballet class, which may be followed by a call-back and, in special circumstances, an interview. Applicants are not required to pre-prepare any material.

While international auditions are occasionally held, usually in conjunction with Company international tours or ballet competitions, Queensland Ballet Academy accepts expressions of interest from international candidates year-round. Via the Queensland Ballet website, candidates will need to submit photographs, videos and a written application with associated support material.

Foundation Program Pre-selection Experience

— For students wishing to join Queensland Ballet Academy's Foundation Program, acceptance is based on the outcome of a pre-selection process in place of an audition.

During this process, students meet with Academy faculty, take a tour of our world-class facilities and view afternoon

Academy classes, prior to participating in talent identification dance-related activities.

FEES, SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

Fees

— Annual tuition fees apply for all Academy programs and are subject to change from year to year. Fees also apply to registrations for all short-term workshops, masterclasses and holiday programs. All other expenses relating to schooling, medical, excursions, uniforms, living and ancillary expenses are the responsibility of each enrolled student.

Scholarships and bursaries

— In recognition of their talent, students may be offered placement into the Academy on a part or full scholarship at the discretion of the Academy Director.

Students can also apply for a bursary to assist with financial hardship during the annual application process, after audition and acceptance. At any point during the continuum of audition, enrolment and progression from year to year, parents/carers are invited to discuss available options for financial assistance with Queensland Ballet.

OUR LEADERSHIP TEAM

Artistic Director

Li Cunxin AO

— Li Cunxin AO has had a long and diverse caree as an internationally acclaimed dancer. He was appointed as Queensland Ballet's fifth Artistic Director in July 2012.

At the age of 11, Li was selected by Madame Mao's cultural advisors to attend the Beijing Dance Academy. In 1979, he joined Houston Ballet as an exchange student and went on to achieve the rank of Principal in 1982. Among many awards and accolades, Li won two silver and one bronze medal at three international ballet competitions, and two Princess Grace Awards. He moved to Melbourne in 1995 to join The Australian Ballet as a Principal Artist. Li retired from dancing in 1999, but maintained his strong ties to the ballet community while working in the finance industry as a senior manager at Bell Potter, one of the largest stockbroking firms in Australia. In 2003, Li published his international bestselling autobiography, Mao's Last Dancer, which has received numerous awards and was adapted as a feature film in 2009. Li was Queensland's Australian of the Year 2014. In 2016, he was awarded an Honorary Doctorate from Griffith University for his services to ballet, the arts and the wider community. Li was awarded an Order of Australia in the 2019 Queen's Birthday Honours List for distinguished services to the performing arts.

Academy Director

Christian Tátchev

— Queensland Ballet Academy Director, Christian Tátchev, received his training at the National School of Choreography in Sofia, Bulgaria.

Performing his first leading roles shortly after commencing his professional career at age 16,
Christian was promoted to Principal Artist at 21. His repertoire includes principal roles in the major classical repertoire, as well as in numerous works by celebrated choreographers of modern times. During his dancing career, Christian worked with The Sofia National Opera and Ballet, Bulgarian contemporary dance company Ballet Arabesque, PACT Ballet (Johannesburg), and the South African Ballet Theatre, where in addition to being a Principal Artist, he was engaged as a Répétiteur. Christian joined Queensland Ballet after participating in the Company's 2008 International Ballet Gala. Following his retirement from the stage in 2011, he was appointed Queensland Ballet's Ballet Master. He took up the position of Director of Training in 2013 and became the Queensland Ballet Academy Director in 2016. Christian continues to perform with the Company as a character artist, and frequently adjudicates for various national and international ballet competitions.
