

Queensland Ballet Online School Workshop Information Pack

Thank you for your interest in Queensland Ballet's (QB) Online School Workshops. Putting the fun into the fundamentals of ballet, our Education Teaching Artists virtually visit your school to deliver safe, educative and inclusive dance experiences.

Created and tested with children at the heart, QB's Online School Workshops are rigorously designed with the Australian Curriculum – The Arts Learning Area: Dance Subject, Senior Dance Syllabus and Early Years Learning Framework in mind, ensuring all workshops complement the teaching and learning taking place in the classroom.

All repertoire and contextual information is adapted and tailored to accommodate the diverse learning needs and experience levels of students in different year levels.

About QB's Online School Workshops

QB's Online School Workshops packages can be purchased online and are available for a period of 10-weeks once purchased. Each package contains three parts:

- Workshop video/s
- Pre and post workshop resource/s
- Live stream Q&A

Workshop video/s

The workshop video/s includes the selected 45min workshop video/s and a 5min introductory video. The videos are hosted on the QB LearningHUB portal on Thinkific, and are pre-recorded for flexibility and ease of access. The videos have been structured to enable student participation under the guidance of a teacher and an additional supervisor, depending on the size of the class. Featuring a combination of follow-along exercises, photos and/or video footage from QB productions, repertoire, small group and choreographic tasks; instructions on how to participate in each section are clearly outlined through both visual and verbal cues.

With every workshop package, an introductory video is included. This video details vital information to students about safe dance practice, workshop outcomes, what to expect and how to behave as well as providing an insight into QB and the wonderful world of ballet.

Pre and Post workshop resource

The pre and post workshop resource is a document that provides teachers with suggested pre and post workshop activities to enhance student engagement and understanding. This resource will be emailed to all schools once a package has been purchased.

Live stream Q&A

The live stream Q&A is a 30min experience that provides a personal interaction between QB and the school/kindergarten. The Q&A is with a member of QB's Education Team and the school/kindergarten can choose whether this experience is catered to teachers and/or students. The content of the Q&A should be targeted to the selected school workshop and can further provide teachers/students with

industry insight. The platform and details for the Q&A will be discussed individually with each school/kindergarten. Please note that there is one Q&A included with each package purchased.

Workshops Available

Listed below is information about the workshops currently available for schools/kindergartens to purchase separately or combined in packages:

Ballet Moves

Kindergarten, Prep - Year 1

Bringing a narrative to life.

Movement concepts are introduced in a playful and creative way through the exploration of QB's Peter and the Wolf, igniting imaginations and bringing the narrative to life.

Australian Curriculum Content Descriptions

The Arts - Dance

- Explore, improvise and organise ideas to make dance sequences using the elements of dance.
- Use fundamental movement skills to develop technical skills when practising dance sequences.
- Present dance that communicates ideas to an audience, including dance used by cultural groups in the community.

Health and Physical Education

- Practise fundamental movement skills and movement sequences using different body parts.
- Incorporate elements of effort, space, time, objects and people in performing simple movement sequences.

Moving to Learn

Year 2 - 4

Learning the basics of coding through dance.

Based on instructional and directional language, this creative dance workshop explores the connection between how we can program a robot to move and how we can instruct or choreograph our bodies to move in specific ways. Students will be challenged and engaged in this interactive dance and STEAM workshop where pathways, directions, shape and dimension will be explored.

Australian Curriculum Content Descriptions

- Improvise and structure movement ideas for dance sequences using the elements of dance and choreographic devices (ACADAM005)
- Practice technical skills safely in fundamental movements (ACADAM006)

Health and Physical Education

- Practise fundamental movement skills and movement sequences using different body parts.
- Incorporate elements of effort, space, time, objects and people in performing simple movement sequences.

The Nutcracker Repertoire

Years 5 – 6

Exploring cultures through dance.

The Nutcracker is a famous production performed by ballet companies around the world. Its festive storyline, dance artistry, choreography, music and The popular and much-loved ballet, The Nutcracker, transports audiences around the world. In this workshop students will learn two sections of adapted repertoire from Ben Stevenson's The Nutcracker to experience cultural dance and how the elements of dance are used to define this.

Australian Curriculum Content Descriptions

The Arts - Dance

- Explore movement and choreographic devices using the elements of dance to choreograph dances that communicate meaning.
- Develop technical and expressive skills in fundamental movements including body control, accuracy, alignment, strength, balance and coordination.
- Perform dance using expressive skills to communicate a choreographer's ideas, including performing dances of cultural groups in the community.
- Explain how the elements of dance and production elements communicate meaning by comparing dances from different social, cultural and historical contexts, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander dance.

Ballet History and Technique

Year 7 - 9

The ideal introductory ballet workshop.

The history and evolution of ballet will be incorporated into the teaching of this ballet technique class, adapted for various levels or experience. Students will build on their technique and ballet vocabulary throughout the class to culminate in the learning of three pieces of adapted repertoire from different eras.

Australian Curriculum Content Descriptions

The Arts - Dance

- Practise and refine technical skills in style-specific techniques.
- Rehearse and perform focusing on expressive skills appropriate to style and/or choreographic intent.
- Analyse how choreographers use elements of dance and production elements to communicate intent.
- Perform dances using ballet specific techniques and expressive skills to communicate a choreographer's intent.
- Evaluate their own choreography and performance, and that of others to inform and refine future work.

Ballet Creation and Analysis

Year 10 - 12

Unpack the detail behind creation.

Students will explore choreographic intent through the analysis of both traditional classical ballet literal storytelling and modern ballet abstract portrayal. Students will learn a piece of repertoire and then create their own movement sequence based on stimulus from Queensland Ballet productions.

- Improvise to find new movement possibilities and explore personal style by combining elements of dance.
- Manipulate combinations of the elements of dance and choreographic devices to communicate their choreographic intent.
- Practise and refine technical skills to develop proficiency in genre- and style-specific techniques.
- Evaluate their own choreography and performance, and that of others to inform and refine future work.
- Perform dances using genre- and style-specific techniques and expressive skills to communicate a choreographer's intent.

Costs and Packages

Once purchased, QB's Online School Workshop package will be available for a period of 10-weeks. The school/kindergarten has unlimited access to the online videos and resources during this time. As per the Term's and Conditions, the unique access password is only for use within the school/kindergarten that purchased the workshop package and must not be shared.

Package inclusions:

1. Workshop videos – based on the package and pricing structure above, the school/kindergarten can choose the workshop/s they would like included.
2. Pre and post workshop resource – one resource per workshop will be included in the package.
3. Live stream Q&A - there is only one live stream Q&A included with each package purchased.

Education Teaching Artists

The workshops are delivered by QB's Education Teaching Artists, a team of highly trained dance professionals who are of an exceptional standard, many of whom have either come through QB's training programs or are former dancers with the Company.

Child Safety

QB provides an open, welcoming and safe environment for all children during our experiences. We do this by being:

- Understanding of the needs of children;
- Preventative rather than reactive;
- Well-positioned to minimise risk to children; and
- Each Education Teaching Artist has a current blue card.

Whilst QB's Online School Workshops model is delivered by a pre-recorded video, the content has been created to promote child safety with delivery always being led and supported by classroom teachers and teacher aides.

Participants and Supervision

Participation and supervision of students engaging in QB's Online School Workshops must adhere to the following guidelines:

Participant numbers:

- Each student requires 2m² of space to participate in the workshop safely
- Space permitting, the maximum number of students participating in the workshop should be as follows:

- 20 childcare centre and kindergarten students
- 60 primary school students
- 30 high school students

Supervision:

- To ensure safe participant and positive engagement, it is expected that one teacher and at least one additional supervisor is assigned for:
 - Every 20 childcare centre and kindergarten students
 - Every 30 primary and high school students

Safe dance practice and venue requirements:

- Students must watch the introductory video prior to engaging with the workshop video to ensure safe and positive participation
- Schools/kindergartens must provide a large open space (preferably with a sprung floor)
- The space must be clear of obstacles and objects
- The space has smooth and uninterrupted surfaces (that is, no nails or splinters)
- The space must have access to digital technologies to ensure students can see and hear the workshop videos for safe participation
- The space must have minimal distractions to ensure safe participation
- The space has enough room for students to move simultaneously without touching and be able to travel across the area, understanding the concept of moving through the space.

Please note that whilst QB's Online School Workshops are designed to be inclusive and accessible, we cannot guarantee that the content will suit the needs of every child. QB recommends engaging a teacher aide, who can adapt content appropriately, to participate alongside children with additional needs.

Whilst schools/kindergartens have flexibility to use the online workshop videos in a way that suits their needs (i.e. varied class sizes, class times, dancing spaces etc), QB has the right to terminate a school's/kindergarten's access to the program if there are concerns regarding child safety, as outlined in the project Terms & Conditions.

Emergency and Incidents

The school / kindergarten will be responsible for any incidents or emergencies and general behaviour during participation in all workshop/s consistent with the school's / kindergarten's policies.

What to Wear

Students should wear comfortable, easy to move-in clothes (skirts/dresses are not appropriate). We encourage students to wear ballet shoes if they have these, otherwise bare feet or socks are acceptable. No participant is required or allowed to wear pointe shoes.

Students should bring a water bottle and turn off their mobile phones.

Publicity, Photography and Recording

QB prefers to manage publicity for all education programs including Online School Workshops. We ask that if you are interested in any publicity at your school or kindergarten as part of this visit to please contact QB first to discuss.

Video recording will not be permitted throughout the experience; however, schools or kindergartens are able to photograph their students during the workshop as per the school's/kindergarten's media policy. If QB takes photographs or video recordings, the school or kindergarten will be provided with Project Consent Forms.

Terms and Conditions
