Queensland Ballet Premieres a Dazzling New Production

The Nutcracker

Beloved Christmas classic reimagined by internationally acclaimed choreographer, Derek Deane.

Brisbane, 16 October, 2025; Queensland Ballet will mark the festive season with a brand-new, specially commissioned production of the world's most beloved ballet classic, *The Nutcracker*. Choreographed by internationally acclaimed dance-maker Derek Deane, OBE, this dazzling new interpretation will premiere from 9 – 19 December, 2026, Glasshouse Theatre, Queensland Performing Arts Centre (QPAC).

Deane has reimagined the treasured story, creating several new characters and subtle plot twists that promise to surprise and delight. Set against breathtaking new designs and costumes by renowned designer, Lez Brotherston, OBE, (*Adventures in Motion Pictures*), the production will transport audiences into a world where magic comes to life on stage.

“My team and I want to honour the rich history and tradition of *The Nutcracker* while simultaneously inviting audiences on a fresh, unexpected adventure,” Deane said.

“Striking that balance between reverence for the past and introducing new elements was challenging, but I believe we’ve achieved something timeless and fresh for audiences and dancers alike,” Deane added.

Queensland Ballet’s Artistic Director Ivan Gil-Ortega said Derek is a master storyteller and Lez is renowned for his imaginative designs and costumes which immediately transport audiences into worlds of wonder and emotion.

“Together, Derek and Lez have created a sparkling production, filled with extraordinary scenery, exquisite sets, and glorious costumes, breathing imaginative life into every scene. This is truly a must-see production, one that preserves all that is most loved about this timeless ballet while infusing it with fresh vitality and theatrical magic,” Gil-Ortega added.

Brotherston said designing a new version of such a treasured storybook ballet is an exciting challenge.

“Starting from scratch with a ballet loved by generations means finding the right balance between nostalgia and discovery. Our goal is to create a world that feels both familiar and full of wonder,” Brotherston said.

Executive Director Ms Dilshani Weeringsinghe highlighted that the investment in a new production is as much about the community as it is about the company’s artistic future.

“*The Nutcracker* is part of every ballet company’s DNA, but it’s also part of Queensland’s holiday tradition. This new production is our way of thanking our supporters and celebrating Ivan’s first season as Artistic Director. It’s a thrilling milestone for Queensland Ballet.”

A timeless celebration of family, fantasy, and growing up, *The Nutcracker* has been central to Christmas memories for generations. Queensland Ballet’s new production promises to enchant audiences of all ages and reaffirm its place as a beloved festive tradition.

Deane, celebrated for his elegant storytelling and grand productions, has enjoyed a long and fruitful collaboration with Queensland Ballet, most notably with *Strictly Gershwin* and *Lady of the Camellias*. His deep understanding of the company and its artists ensures a fresh, vibrant vision for this timeless ballet, while remaining true to the beloved narrative arc.

Acclaimed designer Lez Brotherston, brings his extraordinary eye to the sets and costumes, reimagining *The Nutcracker* with stunning theatricality. Brotherston’s accolades include the 1999 Tony Award for Best Costume Design for Broadway’s *Swan Lake*, and he continues to shape the global stage as Associate Artist for Matthew Bourne’s renowned company, New Adventures.
